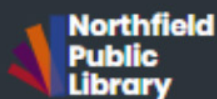

COVID-19 and voting



Vote from home for the 2020 elections!

For the safety of voters and election judges, the City of Northfield is joining the CDC, Secretary of State and many other county and local elections officials in strongly encouraging voters to vote by mail using an absentee ballot for the upcoming August 11 Primary Election and November 3 General Election. All Minnesota voters are eligible to absentee vote by mail.

Please consider voting by absentee ballot by requesting an application from Deb Little or Sara Kettering (contact information below). Return the application to your respective County (Rice or Dakota) by mail, fax or email. A ballot will be mailed directly to your home. You can also request an absentee ballot online from the Secretary of State:

mnvotes.sos.state.mn.us/ABRegistration/ABRegistrationStep1.aspx

Once the application is received, the county will mail the ballot to your home. Ballots for the Primary Election will be mailed to you starting June 26. Ballots for the General Election will be mailed to you starting on September 18. You can complete one application for both elections. Just check the box for "Both 8/11 & 11/3 Elections."

Read the instructions that come with your ballot and make sure to return it on or before Election Day to the county you received it from. Your ballot will not count if it is received after Election Day so plan ahead. You will need a witness when you vote. The witness can be either a registered Minnesota voter or a notary. You can track the status of your absentee ballot at any point during the process and confirm your ballot has been received and counted using the online tracking tool:

Early voting will still take place at City Hall and polling places will be open on Election Day. However, we will have to relocate some polling places due to poll worker shortages and facilities that are closed. You will get a notice in the mail if your normal polling place has changed. We anticipate longer than normal lines for both early voting and at the polling places due to all the safety precautions that will be in place including, but not limited to distancing and disinfecting procedures.

The City will be adding a voting and COVID-19 frequently asked questions section to the Elections and Voter Information page on our website soon.

Additional election judges needed

The City has received notice from many of our current election judges that they are unable to work for the upcoming elections due to COVID-19. If you are interested in serving as election judge, please complete an online application as soon as possible. Applications can be found at:

ci.northfield.mn.us/electionjudge

Pay and training are provided. State law allows for time off from work without loss of wages to serve as an election judge with 20 days prior written notice to the employer. City of Northfield election judges are paid for training and for work on Election Day. Interested persons can find additional information on serving as an election judge as well as other election related information on the city's website:
