

PRESS RELEASE Cannon River and Flood Conditions Update March 27, 2019

The Flood Warning for the Cannon River at Northfield has expired. The river level at the 2nd St. Bridge in Northfield is approximately 896.8'. NWS expects the river level to continue to fall slowly through the week. Weather has been very favorable and has improved the river level forecast for next week. The next chance of possible/significant rain is Monday, April 1. See river prediction details below.



It is important to remember that according to the NWS, fall ground water conditions, heavy snow amounts, and other factors create a 60% chance the Cannon River in Northfield will reach Major Flood Stage this Spring. Numerous factors will affect flood risks including temperatures, rate of thaw, rainfall amounts and other influences. The river level is expected to stay very high through the Spring season, regardless of rain amounts. For reference, the river was at 891' before the recent flood concerns; we may not get back down to the level for weeks.

The Northfield Police Department asks residents:

- Please stay off and away from all sandbag/protection areas.
- Stay out of areas blocked by Barricades and Police Tape.
- Do not go in or near the river water. The river is flowing very fast and it is dangerous.

- The City has sandbags and sand available for Northfield residents and property owners. Please arrange these requests during business hours: call the Streets Department at 507-645-3045, M-F 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. After hours, please call the Police Non-Emergency line at 507-645-4475 with questions.
